

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE DELIBERATIVE COMMITTEE

On August 17 and 21, 2026, beginning at 1:10 p.m., respectively (Brasília time), a remote meeting of the Deliberative Committee (DC) of the Graduate Program in Pharmacology and Medicinal Chemistry (PPGFQM) was held to ratify the final results of the 2026-2 admissions process. The meeting was chaired by the Program Coordinator, Prof. Luciene da Silva Lara Morcillo. The following permanent faculty members were present: Claudia Lucia Martins Silva, Floriano Paes Silva Junior, Luzineide Wanderley Tinoco, Manuella Lanzetti Daher de Deus, and Arthur Eugen Kümmerle, as well as student representatives Priscilla Cristine de Oliveira Mineiro and Gabriel Afonso Bastos Esteves.

The meeting began with the Coordinator informing the Committee about the situation of candidate Nayab Bano. The candidate's grades are presented in Table 1 below:

Although the candidate obtained a final grade of 7.02, her grade for the Evaluation and Oral Defense of the Research Pre-Project (AAPP) was below 7.0, with a score of 5.0 (or 4.0 when considering the maximum score of 8 points). The Call for Applications states:

“7.4. Stage 3 – Evaluation and Oral Defense of the Research Pre-Project (AAPP) and the candidate's curriculum.

7.4.10. Stage 3 shall be conducted by the Evaluation Committee, which shall assign a score ranging from 0.0 (zero) to 10.0 (ten) for this stage. Candidates who obtain a score lower than 7.0 (seven) shall not be approved in the selection process.”

The DC deliberated on and approved the non-approval of the candidate. The preliminary publication of the grades, which had listed the candidate as approved, will be corrected, and the candidate will be notified.

Next, the Coordination informed the Committee about the release of six CAPES scholarships for the Master's program on August 31, 2026, in addition to the two CAPES and CNPq scholarships that are already available for implementation.

The Coordinator presented the table containing the final grades of the candidates in the Master's selection process (Table 2).

The candidate 155.***.***-78 applied to the selection process through the affirmative action system based on economic vulnerability. The candidate submitted a valid CADÚnico registration and provided supporting documentation demonstrating that she had received a scholarship throughout her educational training in the private school system (Item 4.7.1 of Call for Applications No. 714, SEI 23079.226845/2026-62). Her documentation was approved by the DC.

The candidate 158.***.***-83 and 039.***.***-95 applied to the selection process through the racial affirmative action quota. Candidate 158.***.***-83 underwent the UFRJ hetero-identification procedure and was deemed eligible. Candidate 039.***.***-95 did not attend the hetero-identification procedure, and her application was therefore transferred to the general competition category.

The candidate 158.***.***-36 applied to the selection process through the affirmative action quota for persons with disabilities (PwD). Her documentation was reviewed and approved by the DC, in accordance with Call for Applications No. 714, SEI 23079.226845/2026-62.

The candidate 178.***.***-61 declared, at the time of registration, his intention to receive a scholarship while also having other income.

On August 19, candidate 039.***.***-95 declared by email that she wished to receive a scholarship while also having other income.

In accordance with the internal regulations approved on July 13, 2026, regarding the scholarship allocation process, the following criteria were taken into consideration:

Priority 01: Economic vulnerability

Priority 02: Reserved scholarships for affirmative action and for the purpose of promoting retention in the PPGFQM, in accordance with UFRJ Resolution No. 118/2022.

Priority 03: Dedication to the Program

No priority: Candidates with other sources of income

Based on these criteria, the DC established the order of candidates to be called for scholarship implementation (Table 3):

Regarding admission to the Doctoral Program, the Coordinator emphasized that there are no scholarships scheduled to be implemented this semester and presented the table containing the final grades of the candidates in the doctoral selection process (Table 4).

Candidates 125.***.***-97 e 148.***.***-18 applied to the selection process through the racial affirmative action quota. Both candidates underwent the UFRJ hetero-identification procedure and were deemed eligible.

Candidate 172.***.***-90 applied to the selection process through the affirmative action quota for persons with disabilities (PwD). Her documentation was reviewed and approved by the DC, in accordance with Call for Applications No. 715, SEI 23079.226845/2026-62.

All candidates declared, at the time of registration, that they wished to receive a scholarship and intended to devote themselves exclusively to the PPGFQM.

The same scholarship allocation criteria mentioned above were used to establish the order of candidates to be called for scholarship implementation (Table 6).
